

Letter from the Mayor

Hello Everyone, As we head into fall it is a time to reflect on things that we are thankful for. As Mayor, I am thankful for the citizens of Lincoln Park. I appreciate everyone working with us as we come out from under state control. A prime example is the resounding support shown for the police/fire millage renewal that passed in August. I am also thankful for our workers. They have seen pay cuts, reduction of benefits and long hours. Some have left but there is a solid force that remains behind. They do a great job for us every day. Please thank them when you have an opportunity.

Wherever I go, including the high school, I am asked about our roads. I will not deny that some of our roads have issues. What we do have now that we didn't have is a plan to get them in shape. It doesn't mean that each road will be replaced next year. It means that we will utilize all of our resources within our budget to aggressively attack the problem. We are also seeking grant monies from the federal, state and county governments. We have had some success with the majority of the costs for the following projects: Hazel street bridge, Emmons between Fort and Wyandotte, Moran west of Dix and Southfield Road between Lafayette and Fort. While every road cannot be replaced, it is imperative that it be safe to travel upon. The Department of Public Service, under John Kozuh, has the means to make repairs that are longer lasting.

The second thing that comes up is the state of the shopping plazas. I refer to them as the Sears and Lincoln Park Plaza. City Manager Matt Coppler and EDC Director Giles Tucker are working with the owners to make them what they were. I expect good things from the Sears plaza within a year. There are new owners of the LP plaza and they have exciting plans as well.

This has been an exciting year at the bandshell. The concert series has returned full time. Not only on Thursdays but additional days for the downriver cruise. A new venture, Art in the Park, was very successful with over 30 vendors and live music. We hope to make this an annual event. The best though, in my opinion, was the return of day program for kids during the summer. From 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. during 7 weeks of the summer, kids had an opportunity to learn, play and have a great time. The best part was a play that they rehearsed with Ms. Knick, the drama teacher at LPHS. The driving force of all of the programs mentioned above is Maureen Tobin. She has been with us for just over a year and has made a terrific impact. We were all sorry to see long time director Don Cook retire but now it is in the capable hands of Doreen Christian. I believe that Lincoln Park is on the right track. City manager Matt Coppler has done a great job for us as we work come out of state control. This is a long process but we are making progress. It is not only up to us to make Lincoln Park great. It is the duty of every citizen to help out. There are many avenues for you to volunteer: service clubs such as Exchange and Rotary, your house of worship, Community groups. We need your help.

Lastly, my good friend and Lincoln Park native, Bill Morrison, will have a display of his art work at the LP historical museum October 15 through December 30. The opening reception is Saturday October 15 from 6-9:00 p.m. Bill has done work for Disney, the Simpsons, Futurama and has his own line of comic books.



TRASH

The City of Lincoln Park has contracted with Rizzo Environmental Services for Trash pickup. Trash must be placed on your curb no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before and no later than 7:00 a.m. on your scheduled trash day. Trash put out after 7:00 a.m. may not be picked up. Trash bins must be placed on the curb, not in the roadway. If you have any issues regarding your trash pickup or your trash was missed, please contact Rizzo Environmental Services directly at 888-U S RIZZO (888-877-4996), or the Department of Public Services at (313) 386-9000. Any other questions regarding items that are permissible to be picked up may be asked by calling either of these numbers. The City of Lincoln Park no longer provides for special pickups. Every residence is permitted one bulk item per week out with your regular trash. If a residence has more than the allotted amount of bulk trash, these items may be taken to the Department of Public Services for a fee. Please contact The Department of Public Services for any dumping questions.

CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

What do you do with your Christmas Tree when Christmas is over? Well the City, with Rizzo Environmental Services, provides a means for residents to safely dispose of your Christmas Tree. If your tree is 6 feet or less in height, you may place it at the curbside on your designated trash day and Rizzo Services will pick it up. Trees that are over 6 feet will need to be cut in half before putting it to the curbside. This is a service the City provides to make your holidays easier.

SNOW

As the snow begins to fall, it is vital that the Department of Public Service be able to remove it from the streets so as to provide you with safe access. If a snow emergency is declared, all vehicles must be moved off of the City streets until the

emergency expires. Vehicles left on the streets may be ticketed and/or towed. Snow Emergencies will be posted on the City website, City marquee, City cable channel and the local news channels. In the event of a snow fall where there is no snow emergency declared, it is extremely helpful to the DPS for cars to be off the road so we may plow and salt in a faster more efficient manner. The DPS will work as quickly as possible to remove snow from the roadway, cooperation from residents is vital to this operation.

WATERMAIN BREAKS

If you witness water bubbling out of the ground, it may be an indication of a watermain break. To report a watermain break during normal operating hours (Monday - Friday 7:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.), please call 313-386-9000, or stop in at the Department of Public Services at 500 Southfield Road. After hours, weekends and/or holidays, please call the Police Department at 313-381-1800 and they will contact the Water Department personnel on call. The sooner the main break is discovered and repaired, the less inconvenience and water loss there will be.

HOME PLUMBING

Please remember while preparing your home for another Michigan winter, take the time to inspect your plumbing and take the necessary measures to prevent it from freezing. If you have a crawlspace, make sure all exposed pipes and meters are protected from cold air. Whenever possible, all pipes should be in a heated area or wrapped with pipe insulation. If your meter and/or pipes are located inside of a cabinet, it is best to leave the door open to expose them to warmer air. If you are going away for an extended period of time this winter, your home should remain heated at 40 degrees Fahrenheit, or your water shut off and the water system drained to eliminate the possibility of frozen/broken pipes. If your pipes break or your meter freezes, you as the homeowner are responsible for any water loss, meter replacement costs, and any other damages caused by the break.

REINVESTING IN THE FUTURE OF LINCOLN PARK

Message from the City Manager

If you want to stay healthy you must constantly eat right, exercise on a regular basis, take care of the ailments that inflict you, develop a good self-image, and I constantly look for ways to improve so you can make it to that someday you dream about. Managing a City is very similar. If you aren't constantly doing the right things financially, keeping the infrastructure in good shape, maintaining the equipment you rely upon, employing and motivating good workers, and cultivating a positive image both inside and outside the Community, we cannot expect our City to reach that brighter future. Like staying healthy, this takes a lot of work and self-discipline. But if you are willing to reinvest in yourself, you can attain the success you seek. That's why the City of Lincoln Park has begun the process of reinvesting today, so we can become the Community we want to become in the future.

That reinvestment in our future takes many forms. When I first arrived here in Lincoln Park, we began looking at our financial policies and practices. If we were to maximize the limited resources that we had, we had to make sure that money was being spent pursuant to the rules that were established. Further, we had to make sure those rules provided in practice the best way to purchase goods and services for the best price. We are still reviewing our financial policies and practices today to guarantee we are good stewards of the financial resources provided by our residents.

We also began looking at our neighborhoods and how we can create positive change so strong neighborhoods remain strong and those struggling neighborhoods can improve. To that end we have recommitted ourselves to tackle the blight problems affecting neighborhoods and provide the resources to our Police Department to improve the safety of the entire city. In the last three months sixteen properties have gone through the dangerous building process to either be corrected or be demolished. The Police Department is in the process of hiring three new officers and has recently appointed an officer to serve as the Community Policing Officer. He will be working to help residents address safety issues, as well as, connect the neighborhoods with the appropriate resources to address blight issues they may face.

As you may have noticed, the City of Lincoln Park has begun the reinvestment in our infrastructure to improve the quality of life for our residents. This year alone, the City will be spending in excess of two million dollars on road improvements. Additionally, both our State and County partners will be undertaking road projects that will improve the overall condition of our roadways and provide for safe and efficient travel within the City. Also, over one million dollars of work is being done on the sewer system to reduce storm water infiltration and inflow and reduce the possibility of blockages. We have begun the process of Capital Planning so the reinvestment in our infrastructure becomes a routine function so we won't find ourselves in the same hole that we are now climbing out of today.

By no means is this a comprehensive list of all the reinvestment the City is undertaking for our future. There is so much more happening in the City today to restore our pride that put us on the path to becoming the Community we want to become. It will take the collective will and action of the government, elected officials, the citizens and the businesses of our community to achieve the future we know we can achieve. This is a process and it will take time. More importantly, it will take each one of us working together and reinvesting in our future to make Lincoln Park all it can be in the future.




